1. Chairman Keith Blackburn welcomed members and guests.

needs to move on. Project Leaders should become members of S.C.P., which can provide both insurance and support. Members should consist of creative organisations actively working with S.C.P. to ensure that they have more gravitas when bidding for grants. S.C.P. will act as an enabler who can seek investment and bring it to the town. All Projects will rely on individuals willing to commit to involvement for a number of years.
